

THE LAW & SOCIETY MINOR: COURSE LIST/REQUIREMENTS

NOTE: Effective 5/25/08, the course requirement for Law & Society (formerly an academic concentration, now a minor) has changed. Students who registered BEFORE 5/25/08 will continue with their original course plan, selecting their 4 courses from this course list or from the list of approved courses in effect at the time of their registration.

Students registering for Law & Society AFTER 5/25/08 must select their 4 courses from four different categories on a newly revised course list available online at:

Law & Society is an interdisciplinary minor requiring students to successfully complete four courses (at least 12 credits) from the approved course list, earning a letter grade no lower than C+ in each (C- for appropriate courses completed before the spring 2008 semester).

Students are required to successfully complete 4 courses from the approved list. At least two courses must fall outside the student's major, and no more than two courses can be in the same subject area; the only exception is cross-listed courses, which may be counted in any of the departments listed.

Appropriate courses taken before registering for the Law & Society minor can be counted toward the four-course requirement. There are no required courses, but past students have found GOVT 3131 and PSYCH 2650 particularly relevant.

At the discretion of the Law & Society directors, permission may be granted to substitute an appropriate course that has been:

1. accepted from another educational institution toward the student's degree program (one course maximum)
2. taken as part of a semester abroad program
3. recently added to the Cornell curriculum

The best evidence of a course's appropriateness is the syllabus, which is often available online and can be submitted electronically to epl@cornell.edu for a determination. Petitions for course substitutions should be submitted before the student's final semester.

To facilitate tracking of courses taken and events attended, a printable student progress record can be accessed electronically or obtained as a preprinted form from the EPL office. Information collected on this form will be needed for the completion plan due by the end of the student's next-to-last semester before graduation.
