announces the Alice Hanson Cook Award

The Alice Hanson Cook Award, sponsored by the Feminist, Gender, & Sexuality Studies Program, offers grants for comparative and/or international studies of gender and social change.

Awards range from \$500-\$1000, and grant competition is open to Masters and Ph.D. students, as well as to junior scholars at Cornell within 6 years of Ph.D. or equivalent degree.

Alice Hanson Cook (1903-1998) devoted her life to helping working people, especially working women, on four continents. What she herself called her "patchwork career" included social work, adult education, labor organizing, a tour of foreign service at the end of World War II, twenty years teaching in Cornell's School of Industrial and Labor Relations, and authoring numerous books and articles. She was a pioneer in bringing attention to issues such as comparable worth, maternity leave, and pay equity, known for both her scholarly writings and her activism on the experiences of working women around the world.

Applications must include:

- Alice Hanson Cook Information Sheet
- project proposal and timetable of 750 words or less
- budget (include documentation of costs when possible)
- brief description of other funding sources
- curriculum vitae

Grants will be awarded based on the proposed project's connection to the interests held by Alice Hanson Cook.
